## MEADOWBROOK COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

At 6:30 pm the President, Pam Bowe, called the meeting to order. There were 8 voting members in attendance and 4 nonmembers. Mr. Henry Pollet, representing Councilmember Moore was in attendance.

Approval of Minutes Ms. Pederson asked if the driver of the car which ran into the community garden has been identified. Mr. Pollet responded he would follow up with the Police Department to try to determine her identity. A member noted Mr. Pollet's name was misspelled once in the minutes and a correction was made. After motion made and seconded, the minutes of the May 14, 2024 meeting (which have been posted on the MCC website) were approved.

New MCC Website The President introduced the new proposed website which she hopes to have live soon. In the new website there will be a place to find announcements about happenings in Meadowbrook. She reviewed many other attributes of the new website and members provided feedback. Members thanked her for her excellent work in creating the new website.

Community Discussion Mr. Bubelis volunteered to make more "A" boards to place around the neighborhood to advertise neighborhood events.

In September the Council intends to resume work to obtain recognition of the former Nishitani plant nursery. Mr. Keefe reported the Jane Addams swale work by SDOT will start soon. In October, native plants will be planted in the newly constructed swale.

Community Garden The garden has installed an automatic watering system.

Thornton Creek The creek temperature is high as are the ecoli counts.

Meadowbrook Pond Mr. Skurdal commented he would like the missing information signs around the pond replaced and the pond dredged. Mr. Pollet replied he would follow up with the City on those two issues.

Neighborhood News Ms. Bunn reported a block watch group invited the Police prevention coordinator to speak. The coordinator said the Police are too short staffed to come and make a report over matters such as stolen cars. She suggested self- reporting to the Police website.

The School District reported the elementary schools are only 2/3rds full so they will be closing some schools next year. John Rogers will definitely open in 2025 because as new construction it is more energy sufficient and a safer construction in an earthquake.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:06 pm.
