MEADOWBROOK COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

At 6:35pm the President, Pam Bowe, called the meeting to order. There were 8 voting members in attendance.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> The treasurer's report was postponed until the next meeting.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> After motion made and seconded, the minutes of the November 12, 2024 meeting (which have been posted on the MCC website) were approved with the notation to spell "Wedgwood" correctly.

<u>Elections</u> Upon motion made and seconded, the existing officers and Directors were reelected: President – Pam Bowe, Vice President – Dan Keefe, Treasurer – Wilma Boyd, Secretary – Mike Reinhardt, additional Directors – Walt Bubelis & Terry Vogel.

Nishitani Project Mr. Bubelis recommended the Council work with Seattle Department of Transportation to obtain permission to have signage honoring the Nishitanis be installed in the right of way at 98th & Ravenna Ave. NE. There was a discussion of funding sources and possible community involvement in the project. The President asked Messrs. Bubelis and Keefe to create a synopsis of the proposal.

Meadowbrook Communications HUB Mr. Vogel has arranged for Maple Leaf Lutheran to provide a site for the replacement HUB. The President indicated the HUB would need sufficient volunteers to operate the HUB and there has not been adequate participation. She

would not be able to devote more time to this due to her increased time in her business and needs additional volunteers.

Mr. Vogel volunteered to assist another person in running the HUB.

MCC Website The President is revising the website to make it easier to find items, including putting a link of minutes of past meetings on the home page.

<u>Neighborhood News</u> Ms. Bunn said quite a few flame ash street trees fell on 35th Ave. NE south of NE 103rd Street and SDOT is planting some replacements

John Rogers elementary will open in September, 2025. She is advocating the name be changed to Meadowbrook Elementary.

The name of the 130th light rail station is going to be Pinehurst. At Fischer PL NE & Lake City Way NE, the property has been purchased by a winery which will open soon in the existing building.

Mr. Keefe reported Thornton Creek Alliance had a water quality event two weeks ago in the creek by Nathan Hale with students. The Willow Creek fish passage project at NE 100 Street & Lake City Way NE is progressing with plantings occurring now. The City will give a presentation at the March or April TCA meeting and there may be a ribbon cutting ceremony at the site in March or early April.
